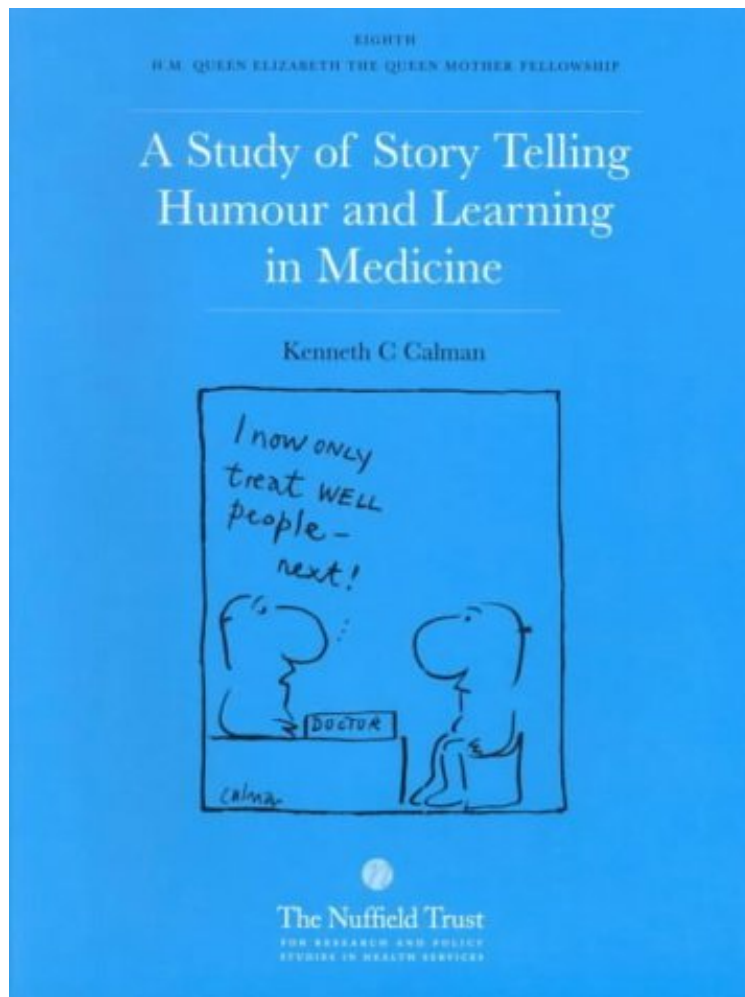

The first is that physicians need to learn to listen to and tell stories. If the physician cannot listen to the patient's story, the patient cannot trust the physician. That is a key element why physicians will lose public support as they abandon treating people and focus on treating the disease they

specialize in. The second item to appreciate is that all the statistics and abstract computations used by the bureaucrats to control medicine can be undermined by good stories that reflect the experience of patients. Remember that the story of the Good Samaritan is powerful. The talking heads who think that they can deceive people with statistics and then condemn Americans as being stupid, deserve to be outcasts. Medicine must have humanity in the hands of physicians.
