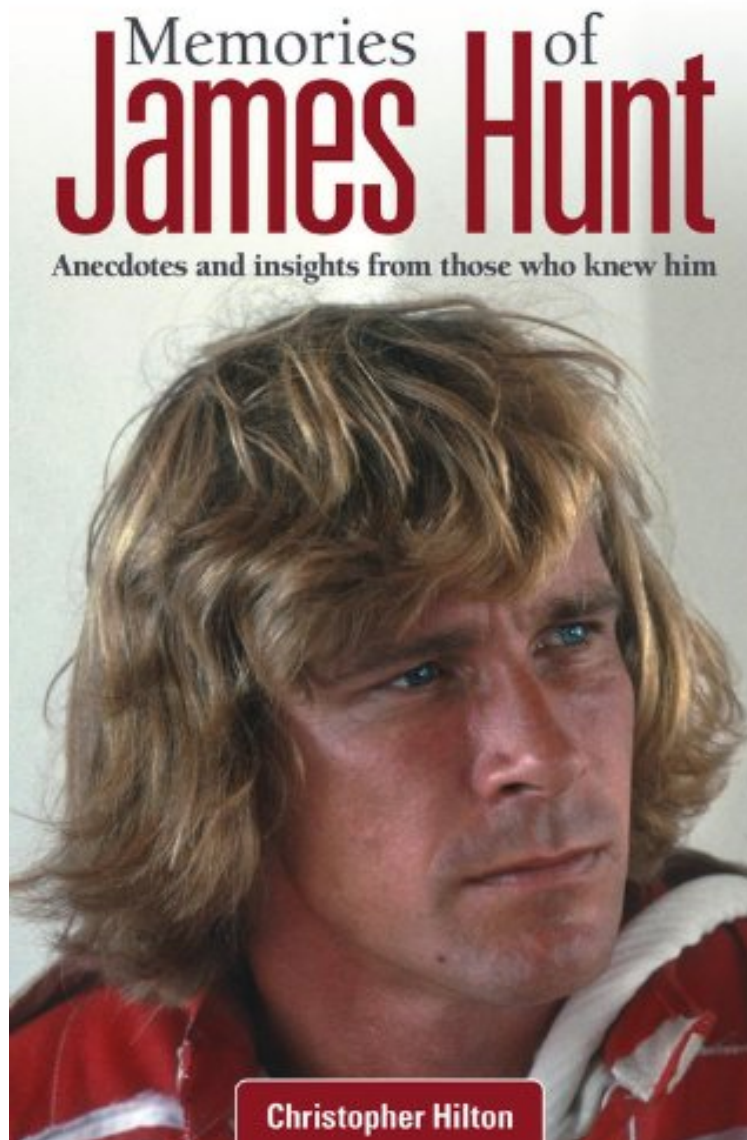

In these respects Hunt was a throwback. He took many unnecessary risks and pretty much felt that was what kept the sport pure. His protagonist, Nikki Lauda, another very fine driver was far more methodical and recognized racing was becoming a business where risk had to be minimized - he ultimately was proven right and Hunt wrong. The problem, however with the Hunt bio is that you get a lot of commentary from a bunch of old British cranks who didn't like Hunt's style, his carefree lifestyle and his womanizing.
