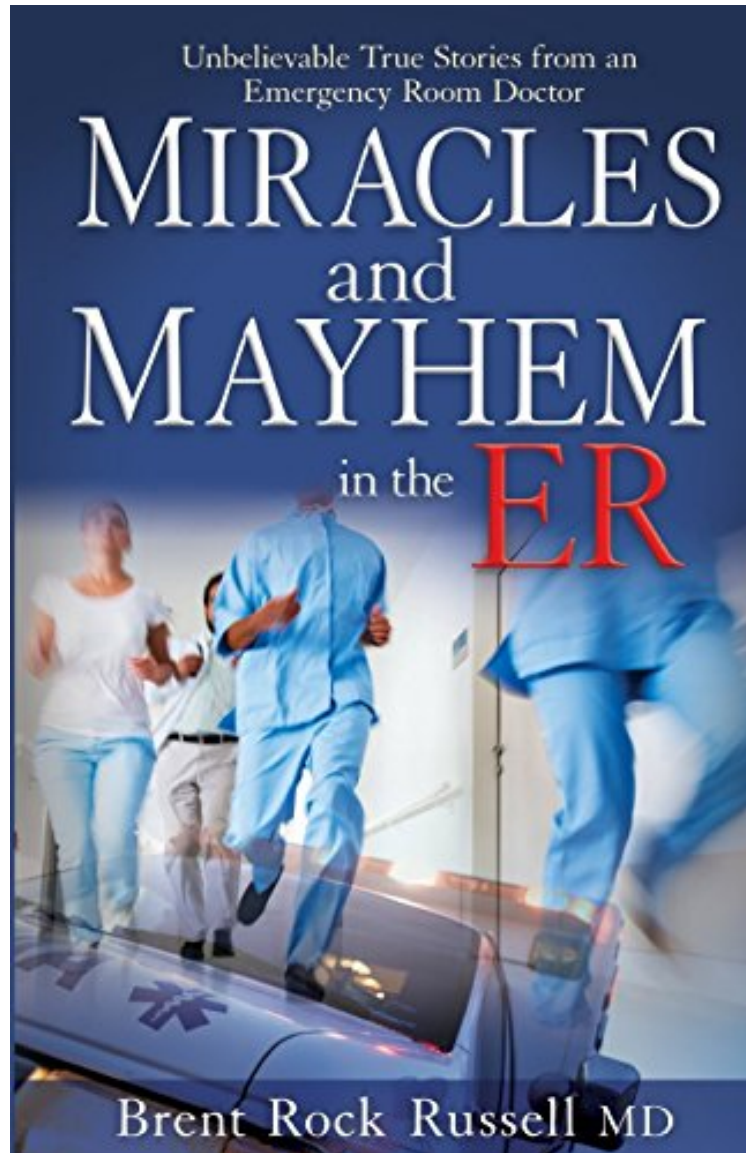

The long grueling hours, the back stabbers, the individuals who suffer and die as well as the ones who have miraculous recoveries. It is often funny, and gut wrenching, like the malpractice suit experienced by Dr. Russell's friend Noah; we are literally on the edge of our seats wondering what the outcome would be. My only complaint about this book is that it appears to be a bit disjointed in parts. Reading about the author's growth as a physician was most insightful; however, some of the personal experiences lead one to believe when and where and with whom did some of these events happen. However, the author does say as a disclaimer that possibly some of these events may not have been remembered exactly as they occurred. All in all, worth reading.
