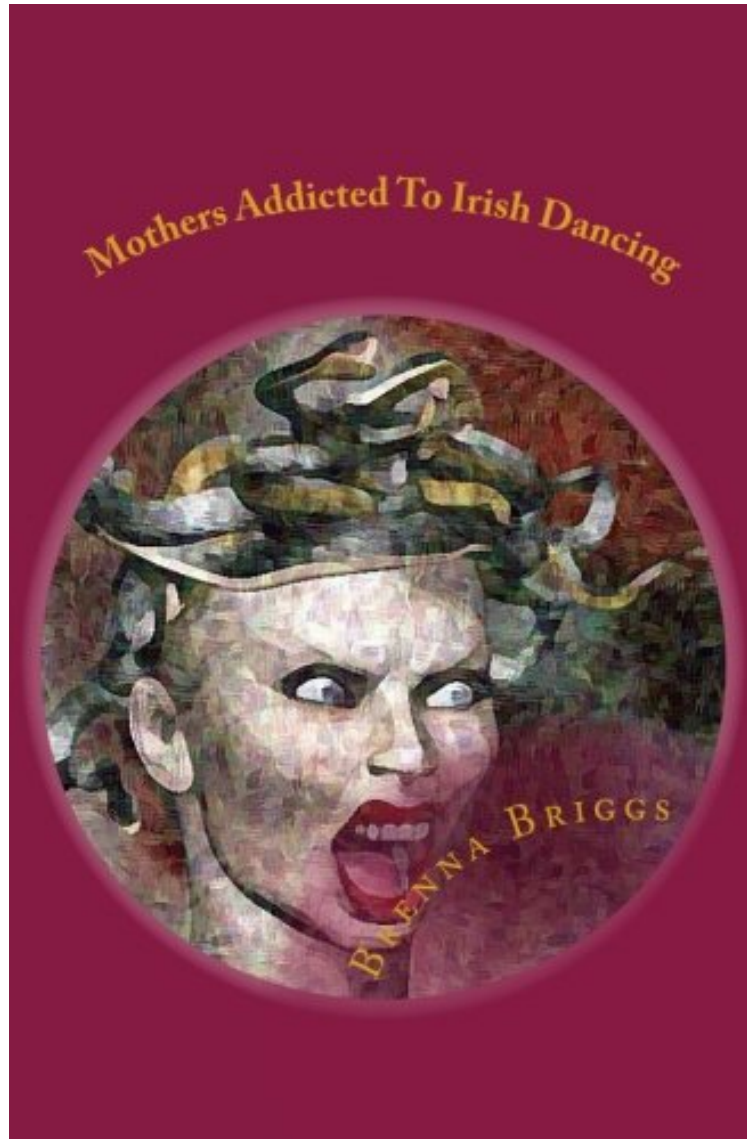

Mothers Addicted to Irish Dancing: MAIDS is a dark comedy greatly influenced by Aristophanes and Euripides. It's an easy read that I finished in one sitting. As a mother of Irish dancing daughters--although I wouldn't

describe myself as an actual MAID--I took great delight in the hilarious characters and scenarios that unfolded throughout the book. My 13-year-old daughter, herself a Prelim Champ who competes in both solos and figures events, picked up her own copy of MAIDS and also thoroughly enjoyed it. I'm really hoping that Brenna Briggs will make MAIDS into a series. The character development possibilities (both with the original MAID moms daughters and with new characters--I personally know many other MAID types in real life...) are endless. Ten MAIDS (Mothers Addicted to Irish Dancing) are traveling with their daughters' U-13 8-Hand Ciel Team to the World Irish Dance Championships, following a four week intensive practice period which almost destroys their dance school. Bringing with them enough emotional baggage to fill up the Grand Canyon, they are forced to confront 'serious' obstacles coming at them from every direction. Among many significant concerns are: a no-show TCRG, no hotel reserved rooms, petty differences and a seriously psychotic mother. How they survive and apply their mothering 'skills' amidst the epic chaos nipping at their heels, is the stuff MAIDS are made of.
