He was just such an interesting guy - somewhat shy but also really funny. He exhibited admirable manly qualities at an early age - indeed, by the 6th grade he was shaving every day. We spent a lot of time playing hoops and reading monster magazines in a dark closet in his parents' basement. Later in life he spent several productive years as the editor of Fangoria Magazine, a favorite of the monster worshipping crowd. But his interests went well beyond these childhood fantasy extensions. He authored a number of serious books, including: "Shadow of Red," documenting the communist blacklist in the radio industry; King of the Half Hour, thoroughly covering Nat Hiken and the "Golden Age" of TV in the 50's; and Remembering Sam, a most sensitive (and true) accounting of his mother's first marriage to a soldier who was killed in action at the end of WWII. Dave died too young. in 2010 he was taken at age 57 by Lou Gehrig's disease. He left behind his beloved Laurie and two fine sons. Even though I moved to Ohio after college and he remained in NY, we stayed in close touch over the years.
