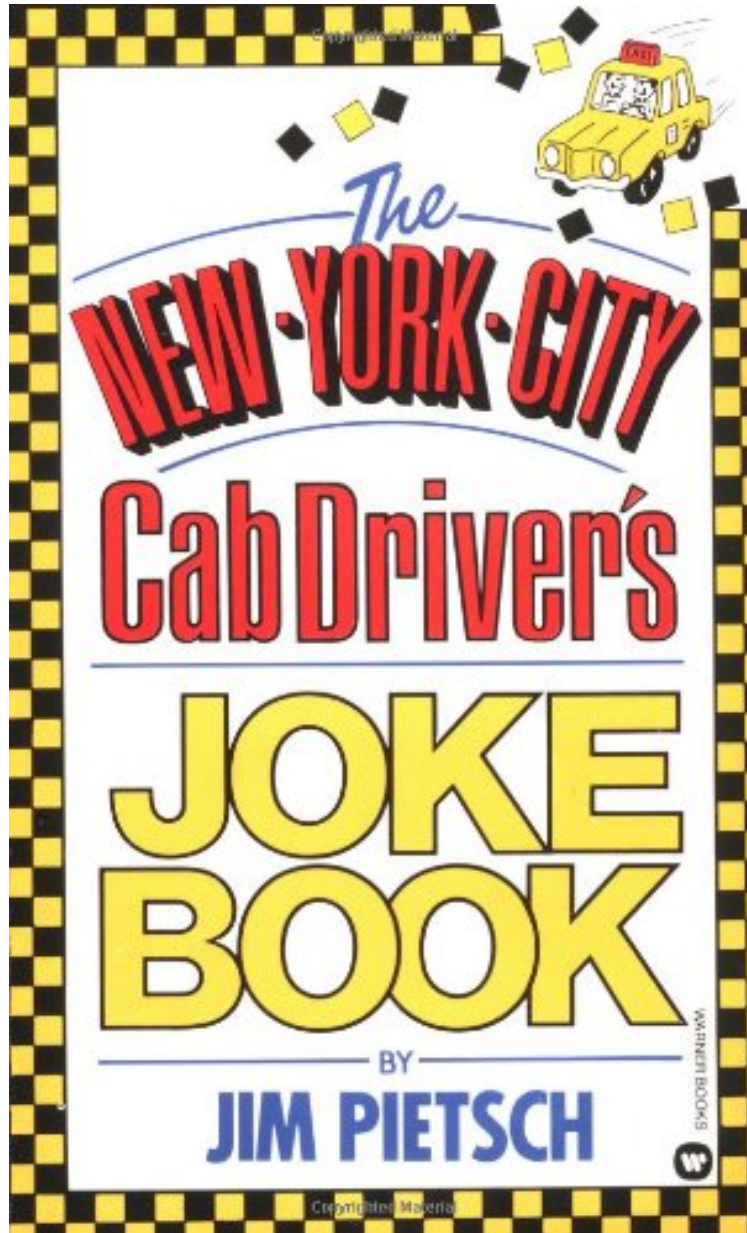

The picture of the author in his cab shows the NYC taxi fare starts at \$1.10 and is 10 cents for add'l 1/9 mile. So the jokes are all old. Almost none of them are even remotely funny. The long ones are all written in a really outdated way. Here is a sampling of the short "jokes": "I was in a bathroom and saw on the wall 'Dyslexics of the world untie!'" and "Q: Did you hear about the restaurant on the moon? A: Great food but NO atmosphere!" (maybe if this book came with an automatic "badum-ching" machine it would be worth it.) and "Q: Why did God create Gentiles? A: SOMEONE has to buy retail" Seriously.
